PROGRAM

The Young Investigators Research Forum 2025 will have a kick-off virtual meeting in March 2025 and an in-person meeting on April 23-25, 2025 in Bethesda, MD.

The program will provide accepted applicants the guidance, tactics, and strategies to better position early career investigators for a successful career in circadian and sleep research by:

- Understanding how to build a successful career in sleep research, including how to foster collaborations and develop mentorship relationships.
- Understanding the policies and various mechanisms for sleep research funding.
- Gain insight on the grant peer review structure and process.
- Further develop specific aims for a grant proposal.

The Young Investigators Research Forum will provide an opportunity for collegial interaction among early career investigators and established senior investigators across the broad spectrum of basic, translational, clinical and population sleep and circadian science, as well as with scientific and program officers from various funding agencies.

FUNDING INFORMATION

The AASM Foundation provides a travel scholarship that includes travel and lodging coordinated and funded by the AASM Foundation to the in-person Young Investigators Research Forum 2025 in Bethesda, MD.

ELIGIBILITY

The following individuals are eligible to apply:

- Individuals with an MD, DO, DDS, DMD, DNP, DNSc, PharmD, PhD, or equivalent professional degree.
- Individuals within 10 years of their terminal degree, post-doctoral training, or clinical training.

INELIGIBILITY

The following individuals are NOT eligible to apply:

- Individuals who have received a federal career development grant (NIH K grant, VA Career Development Grant, or equivalent), or independent research funding (NIH R01 or equivalent) at the time of application.
- Individuals who are at an institution outside of the United States.

- Current AASM and AASM Foundation Board of Directors members cannot be listed as a mentor on an application during their term on the Board and for one year after their term ends.
- Current Young Investigator Research Forum Planning Committee members cannot apply during their term on the committee.

REVIEW CRITERIA AND PROCESS

The AASM Foundation Young Investigators Research Forum Planning Committee will evaluate and score all submitted applications, and make final selections of accepted applicants to the program. Factors that will be taken into consideration include:

- 1. Contribution to Science:** Clear commitment to an academic sleep research career based on training to date, research activities, scholarly productivity, and institutional commitment towards a research career.
- 2. Specific Aims:** Well-articulated research question in the sleep or circadian field that addresses a major gap in current evidence.
- 3. Career Plan:** Strong short-term and long-term career goals in sleep research. Clear justification for how the candidate will benefit from participating in the Young Investigators Research Forum and enhance the applicant's career trajectory in circadian and sleep research.
